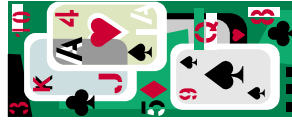

For this last event we are in need of gifts to be donated. If you know any enterprise or place of business that could donate don't hesitate to ask them as it is a very worthy cause.

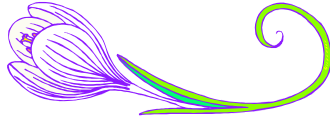
We still need ladies to prepare sandwiches, cookies, squares and a variety of finger foods.

CFUW has A Tempting Holiday Suggestion for us:
A Taste of Newfoundland's Hospitality!
August 4 - 6, 2011

CFUW St. John's is hosting this year's AGM. This year's meeting is a short one—only two days of meetings including a welcoming reception, a first-timer's breakfast and various workshops.

Several pre- and post-conference tours have been organized to show off their province to other Canadians.

On Tuesday through Thursday, August 2–4, pre-conference tours include a **3-hour tour of St. John's, another of Logy Bay, Middle Cove and Flatrock**, and a **5-hour cruise tour entitled "Birds, Bergs, and Whales"** to view Atlantic puffins and minke and humpback whales.

A full-day tour starts in St. John's and along **the picturesque coastline of Conception Bay**, the home of pirates centuries ago, and then to **Brigus, one of the historic sailing ports** of Conception Bay. This tour is repeated after the conference on Monday, August 8.

CFUW St. John's is also offering a **six-day tour** in conjunction with McCarthy's Party. This tour runs from Monday, **August 8 to Saturday, August 13** and highlights interesting places in Eastern Newfoundland, such as **Placentia**, which was the French capital of Newfoundland in the 17th century, **Bonavista**, where John Cabot landed in 1497, **Terra Nova National Park**, and **Twillingate Island**, one of Newfoundland's oldest and most interesting communities. This tour includes five breakfasts, five lunches and three dinners as well as five nights accommodation, baggage handling and motor coach transportation.

National Geographic Traveler magazine rated Newfoundland's Avalon Peninsula as number one coastal destination: "Newfoundland and Labrador's Avalon Peninsula is home to a winding coastline dotted with picturesque fishing villages." (*National Geographic Traveler*, Nov-Dec. 2010)

For those of you who may not be able to stay for six days, a **two-day tour of Woody Island Resort** is also being offered after the conference.

Air Canada will be offering a discount for AGM 2011 delegates on flights to and from St. John's from July 27 to August 14.

In time, the term “board” came to mean not only the surface itself but also the meal, which is where the “board” comes from in “*room and board*” and why lodgers are called “*boarders*” and an honest person came to be referred to as “*above board*” because he kept his hands visible at all times.
