Strategies for Healthy Aging: An Active Brain

Presenter: Dr. Dolly Dastoor, Chair, Education Committee, McGill Centre for Studies in Aging; Assistant Professor, Psychiatry, McGill University

Dr. Dastoor is well known in the psychiatric community for her prominent work in Dementia and Alzheimer's disease. CFUW NEWS

CFUW demonstrates that women working together can be a powerful source of change. Through our network of more than 100 Clubs across Canada working within their local communities, and supported by our regional and provincial councils, the CFUW national office and Women Graduates International (formerly called International Federation of University Women), we are helping build a more equitable world for women and girls. Together we are facilitating positive change locally, provincially, nationally and internationally so that the human rights of all girls and women are respected.

Two CFUW projects accomplished in 2018:

WOMEN IN UNIVERSITIES: 25 YEARS LATER

A comparative study of the status of female faculty and students at Canadian Universities

REPORT SUMMARY

In 1992 the Canadian Federation of University Women (CFUW) conducted a "Survey of the Status of Female Faculty and Students at Canadian Universities" in order to determine the status of women in these institutions of higher learning. Twenty-five years later, with the desire to study the changes that have occurred, CFUW undertook a replica of the 1992 study.

15 September, 2018:

Similar limited availability of on and off campus child care.

Slight increase in policy defining gender balance course content.

Increase in incentives for women in male-dominated fields.

Gender wage gap remains for female faculty.

Significant decrease in gender-neutral language policies.

Increase of female faculty hired for tenure-track position.

RECOMMENDATIONS:

Implement a gender analysis of the university budget, infrastructure, programs and services. Increase availability of campus child care services with drop-in capability and flexible hours (evenings and weekends).

A university-wide policy requiring the use of gender-inclusive language in all documents and media produced for the university.

A plan to ensure equal representation of women in all courses of study.

A Pay Equity plan which eliminate gender Bias

PROMOTING GENDER EQUALITY THROUGH QUALITY PUBLIC EDUCATION SYSTEMS AND SERVICES

Summary of Recommendations:

- 1. That the government commit to funding Universal Child Care at an annual cost of 1% of the GDP.
- 2. That the government commit to affordable, flexible maternity, paternity, and **parental leaves**, increasing parental benefits to 75% of weekly insurable earnings.
- 3. That the government allocate adequate financial resources to hire 50 pay equity enforcement officers and \$80 million per year to the new Pay Equity Commission.

- 4. That the government adopt all recommendations in "It's Time to Act", the Special Committee on **Pay Equity's** 2016 Report.
- 5. That the government develop best practices to address intersectional barriers to women in **male-dominated fields** and support wage increases for workers in female-dominated fields in collaboration with provinces and territories.
- 6. That the government develop and fund comprehensive policies and programs for **affordable housing** and homelessness.
- 7. That the government develop, fund, and implement a **National Action Plan on Violence against Women** including Sexual Violence and Discrimination Training on campuses and in the workplace.
- 8. That the government continue to fund the MMIWG inquiry's work for an additional 2 years and collaborate with Indigenous governance, organizations, and women's groups to guarantee Indigenous peoples' access to essential services, on and off reserves.
- 9. That the government expand access to legal aid, especially in rural areas.
- 10. That the government expand resources, training, counselling, and infrastructure to the appropriate municipal, provincial, territorial and federal entities to create an efficient and effective refugee claims system and to continue to increase the number of refugees accepted, settled, and integrated into the country.

PROPOSED CHANGE TO THE CFUW BY-LAWS

CFUW has had the category of membership called *Member-at-Large* for some time. The CFUW Membership Committee reviewed the benefits and began to consider ways to improve the opportunity to make this a more vibrant and engaging offering. They would like to start on a positive note with a fresh up-dated name that well describes how these members will come together, build connections, work and play in the digital age.

Three motions have been proposed by the national Membership Committee to change the wording of the CFUW Bylaws to reflect the change from "Members-at-Large Club" to "E-Club". We will be voting on these motions at the April General Meeting.

The CRA will not:

- call and threaten you to pay a tax debt;
- call, leave a voice message, text or email you advising of a warrant of arrest for a tax debt:
- request that you pay a tax debt through the use of crypto currencies such as Bitcoin or gift cards;
- have you deported if you do not pay an owed tax debt.

GRADUATE WOMEN INTERNATIONAL NEWS

GWI civil society speaker addresses High Level Segment of the Human Rights Council

On 27 February, Miss Buket Altinçelep, from the Graduate Women International's (GWI) Turkish Association of University Women and civil society representative closed the annual General Segment of the High-Level Segment of the Human Rights Council (HRC) with a statement on youth democracy and rule of law.

Her inspiring statement voiced a call for, not just policy change, but for concrete policy implementation and for youth to know their rights. The timely theme of Miss Altınçelep's statement was enveloped in a quote by Former UN Secretary-General, Kofi Annan, "No one is born a good citizen; no nation is born a democracy. Rather both are processes that continue to evolve over a lifetime. Young people must be included from birth. A society that cuts off from its youth severs its lifeline."

REPORT FROM MONTREAL COUNCIL OF WOMEN (MCW) LE CONSEIL DES FEMMES DE MONTRÉAL

"A Voice for Women in Montreal" for 125 Years

The March 7th **meeting started at 9:15 a.m.** with a review, informative discussion and vote on the **11 Resolutions** received from the National Council.

The Montreal Council of Women submitted the following three resolutions: Consumer Charter for Seniors; Human Trafficking: Canadian Complicity in the Cybersex Trafficking of Children; Temporary Foreign Workers' (TFW) Access to Permanent Status (Caregiver Program).

Others dealt with Ending Child Marriage; Ban Single Use Plastics; Nanoparticle Additives in Consumer Products; School Food Program Seasonal Agricultural Workers; Special Court of Perpetrators of Crimes of Terrorism; Truth & Reconciliation: Historic Site and Monuments; Update: Policy on Advertising of Alcohol and Need for Continued Educational Campaign.

It was also reported that the *MCW's Homeless resolution* has been favorably received by Montreal's Executive Committee and the Social Services agencies. Funding for the City's Day Centers and Shelters for the Homeless has been increased from \$1.6 M to \$2.8 M in 2018 in support of a variety of measures to welcome and assist people in precarious situations in a globally supportive approach in line with MCW's holistic approach. MCW's involvement and advocacy work will continue.

Anthony Housefather, MP for Mount Royal, spoke about his work and experience as Chair of the Justice Committee. The Justice Committee is not a court but it investigates and studies laws and makes recommendations. Their reports have included: Clarifying the Role of Jurors to include mental health support for them; C79 Divorce Act, now one can obtain divorce in either language and decisions "in best interest of the child" no longer based solely on custodial parent; Human Trafficking, including training the medical community to recognize the signs of human trafficking, in both the sex industry and in labour/employer situations. It was a most informative presentation, especially in light of the recent Cabinet resignations and the SNC-Lavalin issue!
