In addition to participating in numerous conducting workshops, Margo completed the advanced level of the Programme de formation pour chefs de choeur (Alliance des chorales du Québec) in 2000. Subsequently, she studied conducting privately with Peter Schubert and Michael Zaugg. She also founded and directed several elementary and high school choirs in the Montreal area.

In all of her choirs, she is known for her original programming, which blends familiar with new and unusual music in sophisticated arrangements that challenge singers and delight audiences.

In 2013, Margo was presented with the Prix Jean-Pierre Guindon in recognition of her contribution to choral singing in Quebec over more than twenty-five years.

In 2014, Margo took on the direction of the **Philomela Singers**, a community choir based in the West Island.

REPORT FROM MONTREAL COUNCIL OF WOMEN (MCW) LE CONSEIL DES FEMMES DE MONTRÉAL

"A Voice for Women in Montreal" since 1893

All Montreal Council of Women's meetings are held the first Thursday of each month at 2700 Rufus Rockhead, Montreal (near the Atwater Market).

Six MLUWC members attended the MCW Luncheon on November 1, 2018 and listened to Nakuset, Executive Director, of the Montreal Native Women's Shelter and the recipient of the MCW's "Woman of the Year 2014" award. In addition to her social justice and advocacy work at the Native Women's Shelter, she is also on the Steering Committee of the Montreal Urban Aboriginal Community Strategy Network and the creator, producer and host of the television series <u>Indigenous Power</u>. In November 2017, she was a speaker for TEDx Montreal Women.

As an activist and dedicated to improving the lives of urban Aboriginals, Nakuset and her staff have worked hard to develop protocol procedures and guidelines for the police, youth protection agencies and health care workers in how best to respond to the needs of her people, especially what she does to shift the status quo for urban Aboriginal women. As she said, "it continues to be an uphill battle...." Nakuset's next project is the development of 23 housing units in a building which needs to be rebuilt/renovated and set up for housing to accommodate a community kitchen, housekeeping arrangements and provide for supportive family and addiction workers. Finding the necessary funding for this project will be a tremendous challenge. It is hoped that MLUWC will support their financial fundraising efforts.

It was announced that the recipient of the "Woman of the Year Award" is Chantal Hébert, Journalist and panelist of CBC's "At Issue" program. The Awards Luncheon will take place in early May.

NOMINATING COMMITTEE

Once again, it's time to begin the process of selecting the slate of officers for the year 2019 -2020. The following extract from the MLUWC Constitution and By-Laws outlines the steps to be followed.

ARTICLE VIII - Nominations and Elections

- 1. Elections Officers and Chairs of committees shall be elected at the Annual Meeting. Ballots shall be used if there is more than one candidate for any office.
- 2. <u>The Nominating Committee shall consist of five members chaired by the Past-President;</u> one member shall be appointed by the Executive at their January meeting and three members shall be elected from the membership at the regular meeting in February.
- 3. Duties of the Nominating Committee
 - a. Inform the membership of the available positions at the February General Meeting and provide nomination forms.
 - b. Recommend a candidate for each office. Each nominee must be a member in good standing and must signify her consent to stand for election.
 - c. Send each Club member a copy of its recommendations at least two weeks before the Annual Meeting, plus a copy of Article VIII Section 4 of the constitution, explaining the procedure for additional nominations.
 - d. Present the proposed slate of officers to the members at the Annual Meeting.
- 4. Additional nominations must be made in writing to the Nominating Committee at least five days before the Annual Meeting, but consent must be obtained first from the nominee and accompanied by the signatures of five members.

If you are interested in serving on the Nominating Committee, please contact me by mid-January.
