Jeremy Clark is an associate professor at the Concordia Institute for Information Systems Engineering. At Concordia, he holds the NSERC/RCGT/Catallaxy Industrial Research Chair in Blockchain Technologies. He wrote one of the earliest academic papers on Bitcoin, completed several research projects in the area, and contributed to the first textbook. Beyond research, he has worked with several municipalities on voting technology and testified to both the Canadian Senate and House finance committees on Bitcoin.

NOTE FROM THE CO-TREASURERS

January is the month when we prepare and issue the cheque for our Canadian Federation of University Women (CFUW) membership. The CFUW dues increased from \$70 to \$76 for this year. When we had set our MLUWC dues for this year, we knew that there would likely be an increase in the CFUW amount but we had no way of knowing how much. A decision was taken by the Club's executive to keep our dues at \$120 for this year, but we knew that there would have to be an increase for next year. Interesting to note that of the \$120 membership fee that each of us pays, \$76 goes to the CFUW and \$2 goes to the Quebec Provincial Council. This means that MLUWC has only \$42 per member to fund its own activities.

However, as members of the MLUWC, we are members of CFUW – be sure to check out their website, especially the "Membership Benefits" (hint: there are discounts!) and of Graduate Women International (GWI). Our club also pays an annual membership fee of \$50 (total) to the Montreal Council of Women and this means that each of us is entitled to attend any of their meetings.

ADVOCACY

On December 6, 2019, Nancy and Patricia attended the very moving vigil in remembrance of the women killed at the Polytechnique.

A petition to raise the age of kids aging out of care was prepared and brought to the Provincial Council who approved it.

The 2019 Orange Campaign recognizing the 16 Days of Activism against was quite successful, with Beaconsfield, Dollard des Ormeaux and Ile Perrot agreeing to publicize the message against gender-based violence. Next year we will combine the UN's orange ribbon symbol with Quebec's white ribbon for the campaign.

We agreed to help Action Jeunesse de l'Ouest de l'Ile (AJOI)'s campaign to build a shelter named 'Ricochet' on the West Island so homeless young adults do not go to Valleyfield or downtown. We will be collecting toonies (or more) at our February meeting to help with this endeavour. See the next page for more information.

NOMINATING COMMITTEE

Once again, it's time to begin the process of selecting the slate of officers for the years 2020 -2021 and 2021-2022.

As per Article VIII of the MLUWC Constitution and By-Laws,

- 1. Elections Officers and Chairs of committees shall be elected at the Annual Meeting. Ballots shall be used if there is more than one candidate for any office.
- 2. The Nominating Committee shall consist of five members chaired by the Past-President: one member shall be appointed by the Executive at their January meeting and three members shall be elected from the membership at the regular meeting in February.
- 3. The Nominating Committee will:
 - a. Inform the membership of the available positions at the February General Meeting and provide nomination forms.
 - b. Recommend a candidate for each office. Each nominee must be a member in good standing and must signify her consent to stand for election.
 - c. Send each Club member a copy of its recommendations at least two weeks before the Annual Meeting, plus a copy of Article VIII Section 4 of the constitution, explaining the procedure for additional nominations.
 - d. Present the proposed slate of officers to the members at the Annual Meeting.
- 4. Additional nominations must be made in writing to the Nominating Committee at least five days before the Annual Meeting, but consent must be obtained first from the nominee and accompanied by the signatures of five members.

Members of the Nominating Committee will be announced at the February general meeting. The positions that will need to be filled for the coming years 2020-2021 and 2021-2022 will be announced.

CFUW's 2020 Annual General Meeting will be held in **Ottawa** from June 18 to 20, 2020 at the Delta Hotel, 101 Lyon Street North, Ottawa, Ontario.

RESERVATIONS

A block of rooms has been reserved and the Delta is offering a special group rate of \$179 for a single or double, \$199 for 3 people sharing a room and \$219 for 4 people sharing a room (exclusive of taxes and fees). These special rates are available for bookings from Wednesday June 17 to Monday June 22, 2020.

LETTER FROM THE PRESIDENT

The President of CFUW, Grace Hollett, has written to all clubs to address the issue of the unpaid dues owing to GWI (Graduate Women International). After explaining how the deficit of about \$29,000.00 arose and legal advice, she set up a committee to suggest the best way to raise the money owed. The conclusion was to ask for a voluntary contribution by clubs or individual members. Here are some excerpts from the letter:

"Full GWI payment is due by June 30, 2020. The Board is very hopeful that members will agree to contribute a **voluntary** amount so that CFUW will be able to pay its full 2020 membership dues and become debt-free. This will ensure that CFUW remains a member of GWI in good standing, and will put us in compliance with the MOU agreement we signed and in a strong position to influence future direction of GWI.

The Committee submitted to the Board their very fulsome report, containing many options. The first recommendation was a national appeal to all CFUW members/clubs. In their opinion, the "Direct Ask" would afford Clubs, and/or members, the opportunity to support CFUW in the payment of the GWI shortfall. They point out that raising funds from parties outside of the organization, for dues or operations is very difficult and, generally, not well received.

In 2019, CFUW had recorded 7536 CFUW members. If every member were to contribute, the individual amount would be \$3.85. If one-half of the members were to donate, the contribution needed per person would be \$7.68. With one-quarter donating to the cause, the individual contribution would be \$15.36. Any amount you send **voluntarily** will be appreciated by CFUW and passed on to GWI. Contributions should be sent to the national office by April 30, 2020"


