# REPORT FROM MONTREAL COUNCIL OF WOMEN (MCW) LE CONSEIL DES FEMMES DE MONTRÉAL

"A Voice for Women in Montreal" for 126 Years

It was a very reflective and meditative occasion when, at the "Special Holiday Luncheon" on December 5<sup>th</sup>, 2019, MCW members and their guests commemorated the National Day of Remembrance and Action on Violence Against Women by honouring the 30<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the 1989 École Polytechnique de Montréal massacre.

Marie-José Potvin, who works at the Canadian Space Agency and is a member of the Zonta Club of Montreal, is a survivor of the massacre. This was the first time in thirty years that she had attended a service to honour her 14 classmates. In a very courageous presentation, she reflected on what this experience has meant to her. She was assisted by her daughter Emmanuelle, who read with great compassion the names of the 14 young women. It was a very special and moving moment indeed!

Following the ceremony, the 53 members and their guests enjoyed a wonderful luncheon, which featured a variety of dishes representing our many cultures. We had interesting and informative presentations by six members of different faiths who spoke of their traditions and celebrations – Dr. Dolly Dastoor – Zoroastrianism; Dr. Chitra Chopra - Hinduism; Alice Solomon and Marilyn Berger - Judaism; Linda Serpone – Christianity; Kiran Omar – Islam.

## THE FEMMES AVERTIES / WOMEN AWARE

The Advocacy Committee delegated Anne Brohan and myself to represent the MLUWC at the Femmes Averties/ Women Aware event at Concordia University on Monday, November 28.

The mission of Femmes Averties/Women Aware: Abused women advocating for the Rights and Equality is to assist and empower women who have experienced conjugal violence through, self-help, and advocacy, in order to improve their quality of life and effect social change.

We were grateful to participate and have an opportunity to meet and learn about some of the front-line services for women fleeing abusive situations and/or sexual violence. The groups attending included students of both McGill and Concordia, traditional women's clubs similar to the MLUWC, and some social agencies charged with aiding women in difficult situations. We learned so much from the people involved in this important work. It was also a great opportunity to raise the profile of the MLUWC. We hope to continue our association with Femmes Averties/Women Aware in the future.

## **Nominating Committee**

Once again, it's time to begin the process of selecting the slate of officers for the year 2020 -2021. The following extract from the MLUWC Constitution and By-Laws outlines the steps to be followed.

#### **ARTICLE VIII - Nominations and Elections**

- 1. Elections Officers and Chairs of committees shall be elected at the Annual Meeting. Ballots shall be used if there is more than one candidate for any office.
- 2. The Nominating Committee shall consist of five members chaired by the Past-President; one member shall be appointed by the Executive at their January meeting and three members shall be elected from the membership at the regular meeting in February.
- 3. Duties of the Nominating Committee
  - a. Inform the membership of the available positions at the February General Meeting and provide nomination forms.
  - b. Recommend a candidate for each office. Each nominee must be a member in good standing and must signify her consent to stand for election.
  - c. Send each Club member a copy of its recommendations at least two weeks before the Annual Meeting, plus a copy of Article VIII Section 4 of the constitution, explaining the procedure for additional nominations.
  - d. Present the proposed slate of officers to the members at the Annual Meeting.
- 4. Additional nominations must be made in writing to the Nominating Committee at least five days before the Annual Meeting, but consent must be obtained first from the nominee and accompanied by the signatures of five members.

If you are interested in serving on the Nominating Committee, please contact me by mid-January.
