ANNUAL GENERAL MEETING GUEST SPEAKER



Dr. Anja Geitmann,

Dean of Faculty of Agriculture, McGill University

The recent legalization of cannabis has triggered a tremendous amount of economic activity in Canada with an increasing number of companies setting up to produce raw material and derivatives in demand for both pharmacological and recreational markets. The Faculty of Agricultural and Environmental Sciences of McGill University is preparing to set up a high-level training program for those interested in working in the burgeoning industry related to medicinal cannabis. The challenges in the industry range from quality control to the genetics of the plant, its sensitivity to pathogens and its complicated chemistry. Because of the lack of reliable, science-based data on cannabis cultivation and on the effect of the plant's diverse chemical compounds on human health, the recent legislative change has opened novel avenues for research and education.

CFUW NEWS

Three financial motions have been received for consideration and voting at the 2019 AGM to be held in Winnipeg on August 16-17.

Motion 1: National Dues Increase for CFUW

The motion from the Finance Committee to the Board is for a per capita increase of \$6.00 for CFUW.

Motion 2: National Dues Increase for GWI Membership Fees and Support Expenses The motion from the Finance Committee to the Board is for a per capita increase of \$10 for GWI membership dues and support expenses.

A financial motion for AGM 2019 has been received from CFUW Winnipeg. This motion deals with differentiated CFUW dues for members who wish or do not wish to pay GWI dues. The Club has prepared background information for your consideration.

Our Club will be voting on these motions at the Annual General Meeting on May 13. Our delegate to the CFUW's AGM in Winnipeg will then vote according to our wishes.

No CFUW Resolutions have been proposed this year. Since it is a federal election year, National Office has sent a list of <u>possible election issues</u> on which CFUW already has policy. Clubs voted on their 5 most important issues.

Our Club's priorities, as voted on at the March general meeting, are:

- the environment and climate change,
- immigration,
- universal pharmacare,
- pay equity,
- housing and homelessness.

National Office will then prepare background information and questions that can be used in meetings with candidates. More to come, once this information is received.

"A Voice for Women in Montreal" for 125 Years

The April 4th MCW meeting welcomed guest speaker, Maylissa Luby, Social Worker and Intervention Counsellor with "La Sortie-The Way Out"- *www.lasortie.org*, a charitable organization working in the health and social services sector in the Montreal area and which provides help and support for victims of sexual exploitation. In her interesting and informative presentation, Maylissa outlined La Sortie's support services for an alternative to the sex industry. This help and support include access to resources or references personalized according to individual's needs, individual follow-up to guide the person through the journey out of the sex industry, workshops and training sessions to promote personal growth and social integration.

<u>Did you know that in Montreal?</u> (from "La Sortie" Information pamphlet)

- The city has been identified as a major destination for sexual tourism
- 90% of victims are Canadian residents
- 89% of female prostitutes seek a way out of their current situation
- The average age of recruitment is 13 years old
- 78% of women that have left the sex industry claim to have mental health issues




