#### NOTES

Once again, this year we operated at a loss (\$1,084), as we have in the previous 2 years (2021 loss of \$482 and 2020 loss of \$2,308). We were able to sustain these losses because we had built up our bank balance over the years prior and rather than transfer at least a portion of that surplus to the Scholarship Fund (as has been done in the past) we decided to keep it in the Club in case of need due to the unknowns of the pandemic. We may have to consider increasing our dues going forward.

Thank-you to everyone for your kindness and support these last 4 years, I will miss being a part of the executive, it is a great team, but I know I leave the Treasurer's files in good hands with Jane Weber taking them on.

## **MLUWC SCHOLARSHIP FUND**

As many of you know, the MLUWC has given scholarships and bursaries to deserving women in the West Island since 1958. Because of these scholarships and bursaries, many lives have been positively affected.

Again, fundraising was difficult this past year due to COVID-19 restrictions. Hopefully this coming year will see many fundraising activities that we will all enjoy and help to enrich the scholarship fund.

Over \$12,000 was awarded this year to West Island women who are continuing their education. In addition to four scholarships for university studies, we support students at John Abbott College, Place Cartier and Centre Jeanne Sauvé Adult Education Centres. And we also awarded a bursary of \$1000 to a student at John Abbott College in memory of Diana Nevins.

Donating to the MLUWC Scholarship Fund can be done at any time. Credit card donations are accepted online through <u>canadahelps.org</u>.
