

NOMINATING COMMITTEE:

Once again, it's time to begin the process of selecting the slate of officers for the year 2022 -2023. The following extract from the MLUWC Constitution and By-Laws outlines the steps to be followed:

ARTICLE VIII - Nominations and Elections

- 1. Elections Officers and Chairs of committees shall be elected at the Annual Meeting. Ballots shall be used if there is more than one candidate for any office.
- 2. The Nominating Committee shall consist of five members chaired by the Past-President; one member shall be appointed by the Executive at their January meeting and three members shall be elected from the membership at the regular meeting in February.
- 3.Duties of the Nominating Committee a. Inform the membership of the available positions at the February General Meeting and provide nomination forms. b. Recommend a candidate for each office. Each nominee must be a member in good standing and must signify her consent to stand for election. c. Send each Club member a copy of its recommendations at least two weeks before the Annual Meeting, plus a copy of Article VIII Section 4 of the constitution, explaining the procedure for additional nominations. d. Present the proposed slate of officers to the members at the Annual Meeting.
- 4. Additional nominations must be made in writing to the Nominating Committee at least five days before the Annual Meeting, but consent must be obtained first from the nominee and accompanied by the signatures of five members.

DID YOU KNOW?

As a MLUWC member you have no doubt heard the names of Margaret Manson, Alberta Shearer, and Amy Williams. Their names adorn three main scholarships of \$2000. each given annually by the Scholarship Committee to deserving students.

But many members may not be aware of the history, and how these women influenced the formation and development of MLUWC. This month the Scholarship Committee has decided to highlight the contribution of Margaret Manson, in the hope that we can continue her legacy by supporting scholarships each year. Linda Ricketts Scholarship Committee Member

MARGARET MANSON, 1922-2000



Margaret was truly the founder of the Montreal Lakeshore University Women's Club (MLUWC). Several university grads living on the West Island back in the 50's, received an invitation from the Canadian Federation of University Women (CFUW) to start a new club. Their first meeting was set up in a local church. Hoping for a dozen or so interested people, Margaret was astonished to meet 80 new eager members.

Forming a club involved establishing goals, writing a constitution, setting a fee structure, and adhering to CFUW guidelines. MLUWC received its charter for the club on 15 August 1958. Margaret was President of MLUWC from 1957-1960.

From the start, Margaret found fellowship and satisfaction from the club that gave suburban life a new quality. Remember these were the days when women were identified by their husband's initials, not their personal name. In those times it was unusual for women to combine homemaking and a professional career. Margaret was a fine example of this, raising five children while continuing her work in education and maintaining a leadership role in the community.

Her career included teaching positions and principalships in several West Island primary and high schools. Ecole Primaire Margaret Manson in Kirkland is named after her. She continued her career as an educational consultant until her retirement in 1988. She was a Protestant School Board of Greater Montreal Commissioner and founding member of many community organizations, including the Pointe Claire Public Library, the Kirkland Library, the Stewart Hall Library and St. Columba by the Lake Presbyterian Church.

She was a quiet advocate for womens' rights and champion of those who learned differently. Margaret is honoured by the Pearson Education Foundation as the namesake of an award that recognizes a graduate high school student who has overcome significant challenges. In 2001 following her death, the Margaret Manson Scholarship was established by MLUWC to support young women in furthering their studies.
