DO YOU KNOW???

THAT CCIRC stands for Canadian Cyber Incident Response Centre?

It is responsible for reducing the cyber risks faced by Canada's key systems and services. These systems, such as banks or phone service providers, are known as critical infrastructure. CCIRC works within Public Safety Canada in partnership with provinces, territories, municipalities, private sector organizations and international counterparts. It also coordinates the national response to any serious cyber security incident.

THAT Leet (sometimes written as "1337" or "I33t"), also known as eleet or leetspeak, is another <u>alphabet</u> for the <u>English language</u> that is used mostly on the <u>internet</u>.

WHAT being "Powned" means?

Pwn is a leetspeak slang term derived from the verb own, meaning to appropriate or to conquer, to gain ownership. The term implies domination or humiliation of a rival, used primarily in the Internet-based video game culture to taunt an opponent who has just been soundly defeated.


