BIOGRAPHIES OF CANDIDATES PARTICIPATING OCTOBER 7, 2019:

Gary Charles, Peoples Party of Canada Candidate for Lac-St-Louis

I was born, raised, and educated in Montreal. I am a third-generation Canadian of Lebanese ancestry. Married for over 26 years, I am the father of three children aged 24, 21 and 10. I have been a West Island resident for over 40 years.

I earned a B. Comm from McGill University in 1985 and an MBA from John Molson School of Business in 1990. I have been an entrepreneur most of my working life - having developed and sold several businesses. I am a licensed commercial real estate broker. My latest venture is Ketotteria - Montreal's first restaurant serving Keto-friendly meals and desserts.

I enjoy singing and playing piano and guitar. I try to keep in shape by playing squash and cycling around the great paths of the West Island. One of my passions is spending weekends at my cottage in the Gatineau valley.

Dana Chevalier, New Democratic Party (NDP) Candidate for Lac-Saint-Louis

Dana is a lawyer, mediator and city councillor in Saint-Anne-de-Bellevue. Originally from southwestern Ontario, she studied Indigenous intervention at the Anishinabek Educational Institute. Inspired by access to justice projects, Dana works hard to humanize our complex legal systems and give a voice to people in need. She leads various legal clinics, is a mediator for the Court of Quebec, a family mediator, a member of the Participatory Justice Committee of the Quebec Bar Association and the John Abbott CEGEP Research Ethics Committee. Dana moved to Sainte-Anne-de-Bellevue 18 years ago, attracted by the community's diversity, its local food movement, proximity to nature, and sense of solidarity between neighbours: a good place to raise her 3 children. She is fighting to meet the challenges of our West Island communities: accessible and affordable public transit, reducing congestion and building affordable housing for families and seniors, among others. Dana will improve access to riverbanks and create larger green spaces to protect biodiversity and fight climate change and floods.

Mariam Ishak, Conservative Party of Canada Candidate for Pierrefonds-Dollard

Born in Cairo, Egypt, Mariam is the daughter of two architects. From a young age, she was taught the values of charity and hard work. Since her arrival in Canada in 1998, Mariam has risen through the ranks with her employer, from Customer Service Representative to Financial Services Specialist with the designation of Accredited Investment Manager.

Her many accomplishments throughout the years include a missionary trip to Bolivia in 2014, being a representative at the UN for the 62nd Commission on the Status of Women, as well as countless volunteering and fundraising activities in the West Island. In 2017, Mariam's employer awarded her a prize recognizing her efforts and her many achievements in the community. Mariam sits on the board of

the West Island Women's Shelter, and she's also a former member of the National Council of Women of Canada.

Francis Scarpaleggia, Liberal Candidate, Lac-St-Louis

Francis Scarpaleggia has been elected five times to represent the people of Lac-Saint-Louis in the House of Commons. He has chaired the National Liberal Caucus since 2011. Working with Canada's leading water experts, he has made the protection of Canada's freshwater a priority. He has also advocated for Canada to play an expanded international role in addressing the global water crisis.

Francis was a founding member of the All-Party Committee of Parliamentarians on Palliative and Compassionate Care, calling for greater access to quality palliative care. Through his youth council, Francis has encouraged young people to take an active interest in public policy.

Prior to entering politics, Francis worked in the private sector and taught business administration at Dawson College. He holds Bachelor's and Master's degrees in economics as well as an MBA. Francis, his wife Jan and two daughters live in Kirkland.

Cameron Stiff, Green Party candidate for Vaudreuil-Soulanges

Cameron Stiff's passion for the environment and sustainable development is reflected in a career that has ranged from working within the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change, to supporting campus sustainability organizations across Canada, to developing sustainability initiatives within his local community including a farmers' market and transforming parking lots into gardens. Since 2012, he has been Director of Finance and Development at Compost Montreal, a social enterprise promoting a holistic approach to organic waste management. He possesses a Bachelor's degree in Sociology from Concordia University, where he is currently pursuing a Master's of Environmental Science exploring the potential for more community scale composting.

Community engagement has been central to Cameron's life and work. He has sat on numerous boards of directors and volunteered with various community organizations, including Sustainable Concordia, the Carrefour Alimentaire Centre Sud, the Urban Agriculture Lab, Regeneration Canada and the Hudson Food Collective. He has been recognized as a Sustainability Champion by Concordia University, and has spoken at numerous conferences on the importance of youth engagement in the fight against climate change. Cameron has been part of the Vaudreuil-Soulanges community for nearly a decade through supporting the work of the Hudson Food Collective (HFC), founded by his dear friend and Hudson resident Robyn Rees. The HFC's mission is to build a food system that is healthy, ecological and just.

REPORT FROM MONTREAL COUNCIL OF WOMEN (MCW) LE CONSEIL DES FEMMES DE MONTRÉAL

"A Voice for Women in Montreal" for 125 Years

MCW started off its 2019-2020 season by hosting a Workshop Session on Sunday, August 11 when, in the words of President Penny Rankin, "40 members of the Council met to participate in a day of celebration, discussion and planning for the MCW's year and years ahead... The day began with storytelling- everyone sharing the path that had led them to join and participate in MCW. We then moved on to grittier business of defining things to drop, keep and create before diving into advocacy and actions."

KEEP: Advocacy; resolutions; lunch and learn programming; 'Woman of the Year' celebration; the BULLETIN newsletter (with upgrading)

DROP: Non-inclusive meetings (conversely finding ways to be more inclusive)

CREATE: Workshops; recruitment strategy; fundraising (e.g. send representatives to the UN; update the website and make it bilingual etc.); orientation videos; greater social media presence; virtual meetings

The focus of the afternoon session concentrated on actionable outcomes within the framework of each of the convener categories, e.g. education, environment or justice issues. For this work to be engaged effectively, there will be a great need for our general membership to join committees.

Its theme, "HONOURING OUR PAST, CELEBRATING THE PRESENT & DESIGNING THE FUTURE AT MCW" was facilitated by the dynamic team of Maya Volpato (VP, Public Relations), Brandy Jugandi (Convener, Status of Women and Constitution), and members Alina Gutierrez and Francine MacInnis.

CATHERINE MCKENZIE AT THE FOREST AND STREAM CLUB ON OCTOBER 2


Time: 11:30 for cocktails, followed by lunch and a presentation by Catherine. Please contact Janet Ankcorn to make your reservation.
