MONTREAL'S GOLDEN SQUARE MILE – A NEIGHBORHOOD

On Wednesday, September 16, Doug Bellevue was the guest speaker at our Kick-off. Here is a summary of his remarks.

The author presented the residents and the homes of this historical neighborhood and touched on their contribution to the development of Canada.

At the turn of the century, this neighborhood was home to 70% of Canada's personal and corporate wealth with most of this sitting with as few as thirty-five families.

These merchant princes of Montreal's gilded age built most of the significant corporations in Canada that, to this day, remain a driving force in Canada's economy. Their combined revenues are in the billions and their assets in the trillions. Companies such as the Royal Bank, Canadian Pacific, Sun Life, Molson Breweries, Hydro Quebec and Bank of Montreal were controlled from this square mile area.

These residents were the nation's first Lords and Ladies and their names, Redpath, Sir William Van Horne, Lord Strathcona, Lord Mount Stephen, Sir George Drummond grace the streets and institutions of Montreal.
