FINANCIAL REPORT FOR THE YEAR ENDING MAY 31, 2019

Revenue from dues was down slightly from the previous year (\$21,768 vs \$22,102), we are projecting that membership will remain essentially the same for the next year.

There was a small "profit" from our 2018 Kick-Off and a small loss from the AGM for an overall net profit of \$160 from the two Hospitality events.

Our spending on Communications was down significantly over last year because the website had been rebuilt. This year we paid the hosting costs for two years because there was a saving for doing so.

Rent for the Karnak hall was up a little this year over the past year and will increase slightly for this year. Rent for Beaconsfield United Church for our Christmas meeting stays the same.

The 2018 CFUW AGM was an "online" event for the first time so although four of our members participated, there was no cost. The 2019 CFUW AGM will be held in Winnipeg.

The Net Income of \$3704 this year will be used to partially offset some of the expenses which will be borne by our members who will be attending the CFUW AGM and Conference in August 2019.
